Consultancy Work:

A) Dr Shirish Shitole:

1. Resource Psychologist for Daily, Sakal Newspaper in Education (NIE) Project on VISION 2020:

Hon. Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam and his associates have given us a dream of developed India: VISION 2020. Sakal paper, through NIE, wanted to spread this vision among 25000 children from schools across Maharashtra. For this noble cause, I had designed and utilized innovative technique for youth trainers to understand India's current reality and dreaming of their careers in consonance with VISION 2020. They, in turn, used the same technique during training for school children. The response was so overwhelming that Sakal paper had sent the story to Dr. A.P.J. Kalam who was President of India at that time. Kalamji hailed this effort and had given 50 minutes to NIE team during his visit to Pune.

2. Designer of Teaching and Learning Module for UPSC Mains General Studies Paper No. IV- 'Ethics, Integrity and Aptitude' for Jnana Prabodhini, Pune

UPSC has made drastic changes in Civil Services Examination System in 2012. During selection process, apart from knowledge, it has now emphasized on attitudes, aptitudes and motivations of aspirants. A new paper has been introduced which relates to foundational aptitudes for civil services, integrity, professionalism, social and political attitudes and behaviours, emotional intelligence, leadership, teamwork, management of change, work-life balance, decision making dynamics etc. in public service. In this unique paper, questions are open-ended and partly based on case studies. They don't demand information and facts but demand self- reflection. It helps to understand the psychic make-up of candidate.

I have designed the module and delivered workshops in collaboration with effective Class-I officers serving India today (**Details given in Point No. 8A)

3. Resource Psychologist on 'Child and Youth Personality Development Programme', Jnana Prabodhini Institute of Psychology (Pune):

We had taken different personality development exercises and made various observations to prepare integrated profiles of children. The data collected was used for counseling,

research and giving further inputs for growth of children. The duration of project was of Two Years.

4. Resource Psychologist for Young Inspirators Network (YIN) of Daily Sakal:

I have taken workshops on career development and personality development for young inspirators. The workshops were aimed at challenging one's abilities and come out of comfort zone to achieve the peaks.

5. Resource Psychologist on Panel set up by Collectorate Office, Kolhapur and S.S.C. board to prohibit suicide among school children:
