#### **Best Practices of the HEI**

#### **Best Practice: Development of Reading and Writing Culture**

#### **Goals:**

- To develop reading and writing culture among the students, teachers and society.
- To create / form a civilized and skill based society as per the objective 'Better Education Better Society' through reading.
- To cultivate reading interest, critical approach and curiosity among students.
- To make reading facility available to the deprived classes from reading.
- To develop freedom of expression in students.
- To develop the reading interest in minority and backward class through 'Book Gift Scheme'.
- To organize lectures and workshops to develop reading culture.

#### The Context

It was observed from the records in the registers of lending and borrowing of books in library that the interest in reading in students is continually on the wane. The proportion of circulation of books for reference and other purposes has reduced compared to the text books of syllabus. Consequently, it is felt that the participation of students in wall-papers and magazine of college has also lessened. It is due to the increasing impact of social media; it is observed that the interest in reading is decreasing. This is being discussed all over now a day. Besides, it is also noticed that the nature of syllabus and changes in examination system have also slowed down the interest of comprehension.

It has been observed after doing the social and academic survey of rural areas such as Padali village, Karvir Tehsil of Kolhapur that the number of literates has increased. Particularly, the female among reading public does not get enough access to the reading material. Moreover, they cannot keep contact with library due to all day long farming related works and domestic chores. Hence the college has started mobile library for them.

#### The Practice

### A) Granthvedh Vachan Sanskriti Mandal

This activity is being run at B. A. B. Ed. unit of the college. Each subscriber student in this activity is provided with books. They are motivated to read and write reviews on them. Competitions and lectures related to reading and writing are organized. OPAC and Bar Coding of the books have been done for ease of access by students.

#### **B) My Library**

The Department of Commerce runs this activity. In the scheme, the books are donated by the students. These books are distributed among students.

#### C) Departmental Library

Each department in the college has its own departmental library. The book transactions of reference books and text books are regularly done.

#### D) Wachan Katta (Reading Forum)

In order to improve the reading and pronunciation skills of students, this scheme has been started. Every Monday, between 10 am to 11 am, there is a publication of student written literature and famous books are serially read out.

#### E) Mahavir College Times

Mahavir College Times is a non-periodical published in order to develop writing ability in students. Students are motivated to compose poems, stories, articles, character sketches, news, advertisements, etc. for publication in it.

#### F) Mobile Library

The activity has been started to develop reading culture in the rural areas. Under this scheme, we have selected enthusiastic volunteers from our college students. Every student is associated with a particular village. It is their duty to do counseling of women and men of all ages away from the benefit of reading. After counseling a group readers will be found and survey of those readers will be carried out. Readers will be provided books as per their demands.

## G) Deshbhooshan Magazine

To give scope to the creative writings of the students, the college publishes an annual magazine entitled 'Deshbhooshan'. The students from Arts, Commerce, Education & Science faculty contribute their articles in various literary genres for the publication of magazine. Magazine committee organizes workshops on 'Creative writing' and also takes interviews of famous writers.

The college, through its various departments, organizes several activities like reading competition, debating competition, wallpaper writing competition, elocution competition on social issues and road shows etc.

#### **Evidence of Success**

- Scope of expression and reading competencies among students were broadened.
- The exchange transaction of books, magazines and journals in the libraries increased.

- Various activities concerning reading increased student's creative consciousness. The college is receiving qualitative articles to be published in Mahavir Times and 'Deshbhooshan' Magazine.
- Due to the books provided by the mobile library scheme the reading habit has increased among the rural readers.
- The student participants in Granthvedh and Maze Granthalaya scheme are found writing book reviews and critical articles.

#### **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:**

- Demand of specific books by readers is high, but availability is limited.
- Demands of variety of genre of books are there from readers which are partially fulfilled.
- Some readers are not punctual so the returning of books is delayed.
- Books available in library are mostly in Marathi language.
- Books donated by donors are as per their choice and not as per our demand.

#### **Best Practice: Career Conference, Exhibition and Guidance**

#### **Goals:**

- To guide students in choosing appropriate career.
- To measure aptitude of students for their career choice.
- To develop career information database.
- To provide real life counseling opportunity to P.G. students of counseling psychology in order to learn professional skills and outlook.
- To sensitize students about career development stages, concerns and coping mechanisms in real life.
- To make students aware of work-life balance for effective living.

#### **The Context**

The present higher education system (conventional courses in particular) doesn't provide proper orientation and training for students regarding future career opportunities. To meet this need the post-graduation department in Counseling Psychology has taken the initiatives to conduct the career conference. Every year department conducts the career conference for all students. The students of M.A. II actively participate in preparing the concept design with the

help of In Charge Shri. Shirish Shitole (Asst. Professor, Psychology), Dr. B. A. Naik (Head of the Dept.) and Shri. S. P. Sankpal (Asst. Professor, Psychology).

#### The Practice

The concept design is developed by students of M.A. II under the mentoring of In-Charge Shri. Shirish Shitole (Asst. Professor, Psychology), Dr. B. A. Naik (Head of the Dept.) and Shri. S. P. Sankpal (Asst. Professor, Psychology). The work for conference includes collection of information about courses and career opportunities in following areas:

◆ Arts ◆ Commerce ◆ Science ◆ Languages ◆ Professional Careers ◆ Education ◆ Print and
 Mass Media ◆ Entrepreneurship and Business opportunities through government schemes and
 initiatives ◆ Career especially for women ◆ New Emerging fields

The work is distributed among students two months before the conference. The previous database is made available to students to avoid repetitive work. Students use internet, websites, magazines, university portals, university directories, newspapers, government Udyog Bhavans to collect detailed information about various courses and job titles. The information is then categorized effectively. The areas are divided among students judiciously and they prepare themselves for the conference day where they have test students' aptitudes and guide them accordingly.

Another feature of this conference is the exhibition of career related posters. The posters cover different areas of careers and jobs related to them through graphs, pictures, flow charts and diagrams. It covers different concerns during career developments and strategies to handle them in effective manner. The posters related to developmental aspects of human beings, effective living, balance of rational and emotional world, mental fitness, life and work balance, life satisfaction, balanced life styles to handle stress related aspects of professional life etc.

Our M. A. (I) students' carry Aptitude testing scientifically in a separate room and find out the areas of interest of counselee. The counselee then visits appropriate table in conference room where He / she gets proper guidance about the courses, job titles and required traits, skills and knowledge related to his/her area of interest.

#### **Evidence of Success**

The conference is the awaited programme of our college. The students from all faculties (Arts, Commerce, Science and B. A. B. Ed.) visit the conference and take the benefit of scientific aptitude testing and career counseling service. It gives an opportunity for P.G. students of Counseling Psychology to learn professional skills for real life counseling. The visitors also see the exhibition keenly and understand the real life dynamics of career.

Every year approximately 500 students visit the conference while nearly 120-150 students take aptitude tests and get counseled accordingly. Throughout the year, students visit Psychology

professors informally for their problems and teachers help them to deal the problems. The media has also hailed it and the adequate space is given by them for publicity of the conference.
